

The W-Start Sentence:

When you begin a sentence with a W-word. This makes the writing sound thoughtful and knowledgeable.

(e.g. Who, while, when, where, what, whereas).

1. When the baking was done, the ovens were cleaned thoroughly.
2. With Snowball gone, there was no one to challenge Napoleon's rule.

Explore the Subject:

An advanced type of sentence, this adds information about the subject.

The Rule:

Begin your sentence with the subject, then comma, then say something interesting about the subject, then another comma, then finish the sentence.

1. Symbolism, which usually creates depth and atmosphere, was remarkably absent from the poem.
2. Snowball, who strived to improve all the animals lives, left the farm to save himself.
