## The W-Start Sentence:

When you begin a sentence with a W-word. This makes the writing sound thoughtful and knowledgeable.

(e.g. Who, while, when, where, what, whereas).

- 1. When the baking was done, the ovens were cleaned thoroughly.
- 2. With Snowball gone, there was no one to challenge Napoleon's rule.

## **Explore the Subject:**

An advanced type of sentence, this adds information about the subject.

## The Rule:

Begin your sentence with the subject, then comma, then say something interesting about the subject, then another comma, then finish the sentence.

- 1. Symbolism, which usually creates depth and atmosphere, was remarkably absent from the poem.
- 2. Snowball, who strived to improve all the animals lives, left the farm to save himself.
