Point of View

This is referring to the choice of where the author places the narrator of the story.

Point of View

Either the narrator is part of the story or merely informing the reader of someone else's story.

Point of View

The two types are called first person and third person.

First Person

Telling a story in first person means placing the narrator as the central character.

First Person

Theirs is the voice
the reader hears. The
story is told through
their eyes.

First Person

The way this is accomplished is through the use of I.

E.g. As I ran through the door, a speck of dust got in my eye.

First Person

Third Person

Telling a story in third person means placing the narrator outside the story.

Third Person

They are telling
someone else's story. It
is an outside
perspective.

Third Person

This is accomplished through the use of he/she.
